Based on the request of the Faculty of Dentistry, Minia University grants the following degrees: Bachelor's degree in Oral and Dental Surgery • B.D.S

### **Article 3:**

The duration of the study to obtain the bachelor's degree in oral and dental surgery is five years that include the preparatory year and is divided into three stages (Preparatory stage.)

(Pre-clinical stage (first and second year.) (Clinical stage (3rd and 4th year.)

#### Article 4:

The subjects taught for obtaining the bachelor's degree in oral and dental surgery are as follow

#### (Preparatory stage .)

- a. Basic subjects: Chemistry Physics and statistics Plant and heredity -.Animal
- .B. Non-Basic subjects: English Computer

#### (Pre-clinical stage (first and second year .Y

Clinical Stage (3rd and 4<sup>th</sup> year)

#### Article 5:

#### **General Provisions:**

- . Written examinations are held at the end of the academic year, and its duration are three hours
- . The student of the first and third year is transferred to the following year after success in all the courses, no more than two articles of basic default except non-basic materials.

- year to the first year, and also from the second to the third year, except after his success in all the courses at this stage.
- . EThe Faculty organizes a scientific trip each year for the students of the final year at the mid-year vacation and for a week to visit places closely related to the study.
- .•A second round exam is held in September for the failed or the absentee student with acceptable excuse from the faculty Council in one or two subjects for the preparatory and second years.
- . A second round exam for the fourth year will be held in September for the student who is failed or absent in one or two subjects.
- ∨The student remains to perform the exam of the subject again in which he failed or absent in the round of September.
- .AThe academic year for each year is considered as one academic semester and includes examinations of year's activities throughout the academic year. The Faculty determines the method of performing this exam and conducts it in accordance with the distribution of grades in the regulation.

.AThe student must follow the lectures and practical lessons in the classroom and the Faculty Council at the request of the relevant departmental councils deprive the student to apply for all or part of the examinations if he is considered that his attendance and performance of the exercises and practical requirements is not satisfactory. In this case, the student is considered to be failed in the courses in which he is prevented from applying for the exam, unless he presents an excuse accepted by the Faculty Council. He is considered to be absent from an acceptable excuse, provided that he fulfills the requirements of attendance and requirements in the courses for which he was given an excuse on the following year.

#### Article 7:

#### Pre-clinical stage:

The student is not transferred from the second to .\
the third year unless after successfully passing all the .subjects of the stage

The student of the first year is transferred to the .Y second year after success in all the courses no more than two basic subjects in which he failed or .absented

A second round exam is held for this degree for .\* the failed or absentees in one or two basic subjects .only

#### Article 8:

# **Clinical Stage:**

- .) The student of the third year is transferred to the fourth year after success in all the courses no more than two basic subjects in which he failed or absented.
- . The continuous and related courses in the fourth year, which is taught in the third year, examinations of year's activities are held for it periodic ally only. Their grades are added to the fourth year grades, the final written examination of these courses is held at the end of the fourth year.
- . \*A second round exam is held for this degree for the failed or absentees in one or two basic subjects only.

. The student will not be transferred to this stage unless after passing the examination successfully in all pre-clinical subjects.

#### :Article 9

. The student's success in the course requires that he must obtain 60% of the total degree of the course exam.

. The student's success is estimated by the following grades:

•Excellent: 85% or more of the total degrees.

•Very good: 75% to less than 85% of the total degrees.

•Good: 65% to less than 75% of the total degrees.

•Pass: 60% to less than 65% of all degrees.

•Poor: 30% to less than 60% of all degrees.
